COMMITTEES:

Cameras, Tom Mallory: Tom reports, that the police departments and Flock are cooperative but police data and Flock data in past thirty days does not agree. Efforts are being made to eliminate shadowing on the infrared images.

Communication, Maribett Varner: Maribett reported, that the next HBNA newsletter is in September.

Community Maintenance and Enhancement, Carol Simpson: Carole Simpson reported, she recently met with Callahan Landscape. Clean up scheduled near Dunkin Doughnuts entrance. Benches for micro parks are expected to be delivered by May 1.

Transportation, Shelby Cobb: Shelby reported, the committee is working on the following issues: Winall Down, Vermont and Club Drive drainage, the paving of Winall Down, pedestrian and vehicle safety on East Brookhaven/Brookhaven Dr. as well as West Brookhaven / Brookhaven Drive. On April 8, Capital City Club manager was sent a letter explaining the "Let's Crawl Y'all" initiative in Historic Brookhaven. Shelby has a list of crosswalks and stop bars that need

striping for the City of Atlanta. A recent email was sent to neighbors regarding street repair requests. There is now a prepare to stop sign on West Brookhaven Drive at the Club entrance. The committee continues to work to make our streets safe and in good condition. Both the City of Brookhaven and the City of Atlanta representatives are involved in traffic calming solutions for our neighbors.
