Executive Board:

SusyStovin, President: Called the meeting to order.

Brian Ruediger, Treasurer: The Historic Brookhaven Association begins 2021 in sound financial condition. Your Board has approved a budget for 2021, that should continue to enhance the beauty and safety of our neighborhood. Additionally, all 2020 tax returns and registrations are complete and have been filed.

Anne Culberson, Secretary, January minutes were distributed and approved for immediate posting to the HBNA website.

Committees:

Security Cameras, Tom Mallory: The HBNA security readers and cameras have the capability to report stolen vehicles and license plates. We will also be getting more data to match with missing persons.

Between December 8, 2020 and January 28, 2021, there were four stolen plates and two stolen vehicles reported but none associated with neighborhood crime. On December 7, 2020, one crime reported in Club Forest. The neighborhood board requested the number of cars in and out of our neighborhood. The board also discussed getting signs for cameras as a warning to criminals.

Filming, Gene Hooff: Report of possible filming on Narmore; more information to follow.

Communications: Maribett Varner, Mark Roberts: Newsletters and directories have been delivered to HBNA members. Mark reports 740 HBNA members in 2021.

HBNA Foundation, Mark Roberts: The foundation funds will stay secured for monument repair and rebuild.

Beautification: Carole Simpson: plans for cleaning and sealing monuments in March.

Transportation: Wade Copeland: Discussed “Let’s Crawl Y’all” campaign to support lower speeds by going 24 mph in the neighborhood. The Transportation committee continues to address speed, traffic calming and cut through traffic. The committee continues to meet regularly to discuss transportation issues.

Zoning, Mark Bryson, The City of Brookhaven is discussing front yard set back standards. HBNA is asked to write residents of 8 Brookhaven Drive regarding clean up of their lengthy construction project and site.

New Business: Shelby Cobb asked that others monitor status of City of Atlanta and Fulton County jails. Shelby will keep us updated on ways to give city feedback regarding these issues.
